From 1st June 2015...

Manufacturers cannot market non-CLP compliant products after this date.

From 1st June 2017...

- Distributor's chemical product inventory must have CLP compliant labels.
- End users must not receive any non-CLP compliant products from distributors.

What is CLP?

Classification, Labelling and Packaging Regulation, or CLP, is a new European Union system for classifying, labelling and packaging chemical substances and mixtures. It aims to provide a consistent and comprehensive way for defining, classifying and communicating the health, physical and environmental hazards of chemicals. CLP is based on the United Nations' Globally Harmonised System (UN GHS).

Why is CLP Regulation important?

It is important that end users know how to safely handle chemical substances and mixtures.

Clear, consistent classification of chemicals and labelling of products, required under CLP, is one way to protect users and the environment from potential harm from hazardous chemicals.

What does Ecolab need to do to comply with CLP regulation?

All manufacturers, importers of substances and mixtures as well as formulators, distributors and retailers, must classify, label and package substances and mixtures in accordance with the new CLP Regulation. We need to author our safety data sheets to CLP criteria and label our products to CLP criteria.

Are all Ecolab products affected by CLP?

Ecolab's policy is to author safety data sheets for all products, even those that are not hazardous or there is no legal requirement to do so - therefore all Ecolab products are touched by CLP.

Will the labels on Ecolab's products change?

Labels on the packaging will change to illustrate new CLP classifications.

The important thing to understand is that our Ecolab products have not changed. It is the classification that has changed.
